Certified Chelation Exam Policies and Procedures

Section 1. Eligibility Requirements

1.1 Doctor of Medicine (MD) and Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine (DO)

- 1.1.1 Potential applicant must be an ACAM member in good standing.
- 1.1.2 Potential applicant must provide a copy of their current, unrestricted and valid medical license.
- 1.1.3 Potential applicant must complete an approved legal history form setting forth any findings made against them in professional malpractice, civil actions that may reflect upon competence or moral fitness to practice, or medical board or hospital or health facility disciplinary consent agreements entered into or orders against them in any State in which they have practiced a health care profession.
- 1.1.4 Register and participate in the ACAM Chelation Therapy Training course.

1.2 Naturopathic Doctor (ND)

- 1.2.1 Potential applicant must be an ACAM member in good standing.
- 1.2.2 Potential applicant must be from a licensed State.
- 1.2.3 Potential applicant must submit with their application a copy of the State law governing the scope of practice with respect to ordering and delivering IV therapies and the IV guideline regulations for the State they practice naturopathic medicine in.
- 1.2.4 Potential applicant must complete an approved legal history form setting forth any findings made against them in professional malpractice, civil actions that may reflect upon competence or moral fitness to practice, or medical board or hospital or health facility disciplinary consent agreements entered into or orders against them in any State in which they have practiced a health care profession.
- 1.2.5 Register and participate in the ACAM Chelation Therapy Training course.

1.3 Nurse Practitioner (NP)

- 1.3.1 Potential applicant must be an ACAM member in good standing.
- 1.3.2 Potential applicant must provide a copy of their current, unrestricted and valid medical license.
- 1.3.3 Potential applicant must submit with their application a copy of the State law governing the scope of practice with respect to ordering and delivering IV therapies and the IV guideline regulations for the State in which they practice nursing.
- 1.3.4 Potential applicant must complete an approved legal history form setting forth any findings made against them in professional malpractice, civil actions that may reflect upon competence or moral fitness to practice, or medical board or hospital or health facility disciplinary consent agreements entered into or orders against them in any State in which they have practiced a health care profession.
- 1.3.5 Register and participate in the ACAM Chelation Therapy Training course.

Section 2. Testing Policy

2.1 First Attempt:

- 2.1.1 Must meet eligibility requirements.
- 2.1.2 Pre-requisite course: ACAM Chelation Therapy Workshop.

2.2 Retesting Policy:

- 2.2.1 Minimum 30 day waiting period between attempts.
- 2.2.2 Maximum of 3 attempts in one calendar year (includes first attempt).

2.3 Failure to pass in 3 attempts or less in one calendar year:

- 2.3.1 Must wait one year from first attempt.
- 2.3.2 Must pay first time exam fee.
- 2.3.3 Must retake ACAM Chelation Therapy Workshop.

Section 3. Exam Fees

- 3.1 First Attempt - \$550.00
- 3.2 Second Attempt - \$ 350.00
- 3.3 Third Attempt - \$350.00
- 3.4 Recertification - \$350.00

Section 4. Certification Title

Participants who successfully pass the exam will receive the designation “**Certified Chelation Therapy (CCT).**”

Section 5. Recertification

Individuals must recertify every 7 years to maintain CCT certification.
