About the Presenter:

He also trained in a psychiatric externship at the crisis intervention ward at the University of California, San Francisco Medical School, and performed psychopharmacology research at the Stanford Research Ward of the Palo Alto, California Veterans Administration Hospital and Menlo Park Veterans Administration Hospital. Dr. Gerber has always been drawn to natural approaches to medicine, and early in his practice he studied with many well-known medical pioneers such as Dr. John Christopher, Dr. Paavo Airola, and two-time Nobel Prize Laureate Dr. Linus Pauling. He has been a chelating physician since 1976 and has been a Diplomat of the American Board of Chelation Therapy since 1984. He is also a diplomat of the International College of Anti-Aging Medicine and is a graduate of the UCLA Medical Acupuncture Training Program. He is the president of the Nevada Homeopathic and Integrative Medical Association, a past president of the Orthomolecular Medical Association, and was a medical advisor and featured columnist for Alternative Medicine Magazine. Dr. Gerber has more than 25 years of experience using Heel medicines in his daily practice.



About the Workshop

Heart disease is the #1 health problem for both women and men in the United States. Almost 700,000 people die of heart disease in the U.S. each year. That is about 29% of all U.S. deaths. The risk of coronary heart disease can be reduced by taking steps to prevent and control those adverse factors that put people at greater risk for heart disease and heart attacks. Risk factors that need more attention include diet, nutrition and toxic metal burden from the body.

EDTA Chelation therapy involves repeated administration of a synthetic amino acid to reduce atherosclerotic plaque and other toxic mineral deposits throughout the body. Its use for heart disease is being reviewed at an NCCAM funded multi-center clinical trial. Data on toxic minerals, specifically lead, that contribute to heart disease are published in medical literature on the effect of diet and nutrition on cardiac health.

Statement of Need

Your patients have a significant risk of developing heart disease during their lifetime. With this knowledge, many are becoming interested and self-educated in non-conventional treatment options that will prevent, augment or replace their current pharmacologic regimens. These patients want to work with a physician that is able to identify their risk for heart disease, recommend preventative nutritional suggestions and feel comfortable implementing a treatment strategy that is effective and safe.

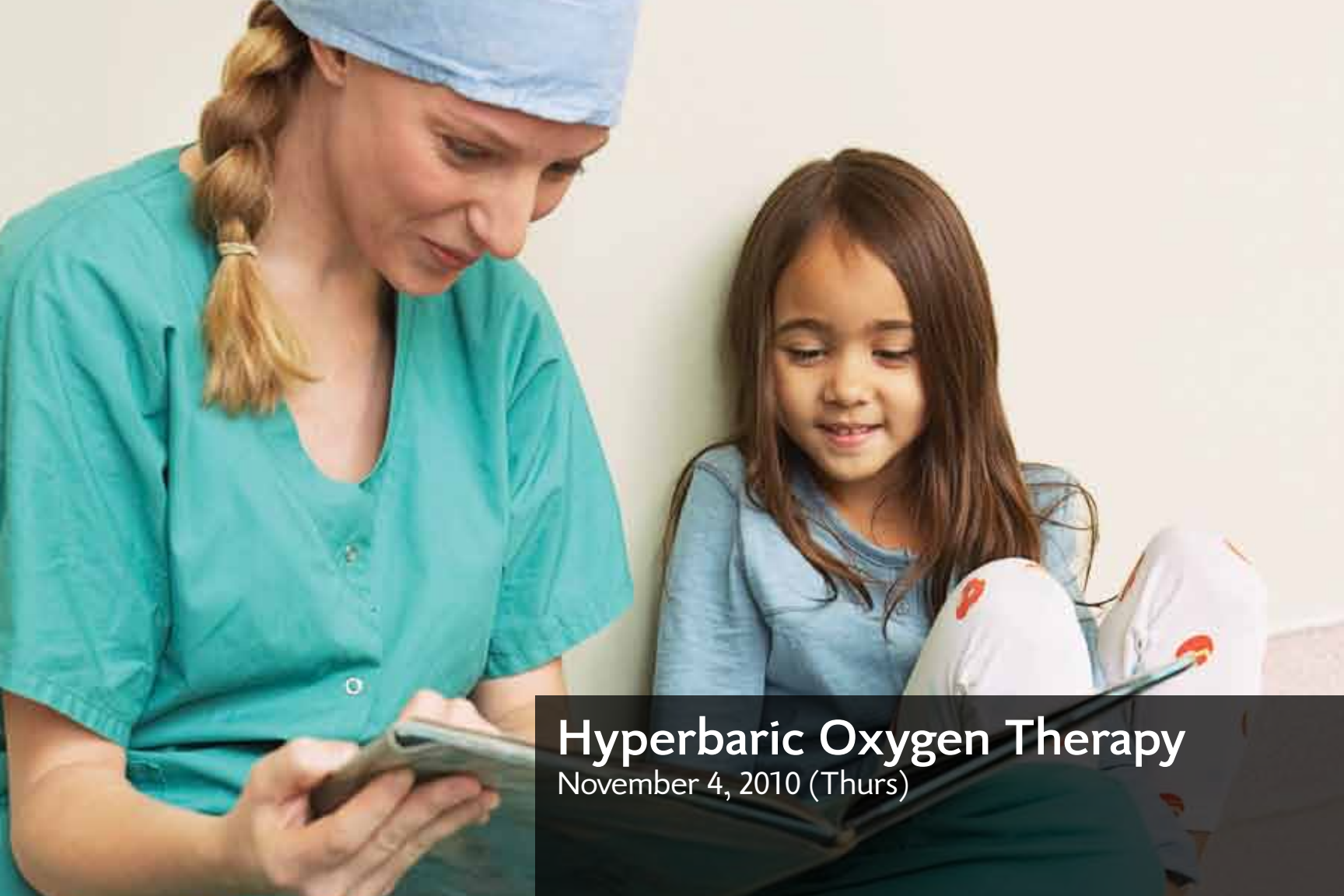

Statement of Need

The incidence of obesity in the United States has risen to an alarming level. Chronic and co-morbid medical conditions, like diabetes, hypertension, high cholesterol and heart disease are all more prevalent in obese patients. The most recent data collected by the National Health and Nutrition Examination Survey (NHANES) from 2007-2008 showed overall prevalence for people overweight and obese combined (BMI >25) was 68%.

However, research has shown that physicians and other health care professionals do not have the necessary tools and education to assist patients in this demographic. Physicians are unaware of the latest scientific findings on the impact of being overweight and therefore poorly prepared to advise their patients about the health implications or the use of diet and lifestyle modification as a treatment strategy in the management of weight related health issues.

9. Review the organic chemistry and pharmacokinetics of HCG.
