Nonalcoholic Fatty Liver Disease: The American Tsunami

About the lecture:

NAFLD (nonalcoholic fatty liver disease) is estimated to occur in approximately 20-30% of the American population. While the risk for developing NAFLD is higher in the obese population, the disease can occur in normal weight individuals as well. This lecture will include information about diagnosis and treatment of NAFLD from both an allopathic and a natural medicine perspective.

Lyn Patrick ND graduated from Bastyr University in 1984 with a degree in naturopathic medicine and has been in private practice as a licensed naturopathic physician in Tucson, Az. and Durango, Co. specializing in HIV infection, environmental medicine and hepatitis C for the last 20 years. She is also a physician-member of the Hepatitis C Ambassadors Team, a national interdisciplinary team of providers and hepatologists seeking answers to chronic hepatitis C treatment through research in complementary/alternative medicine. She is also an active member of the American Association of Naturopathic Physicians and speaks internationally on the subjects of chronic hepatitis C infection, eating disorders, and environmental medicine.
